

***ROUND HILL BUS STOP POCKET PARK GETS FUNDING ***



We are pleased to announce that funding has been secured for a pocket park on the tarmac alongside the Southbound bus stop at the junction of Ditchling Road and Prince's Crescent. Round Hill Green Spaces was successful in an application to the council-administered UK Shared Prosperity Fund.

Planning permission was secured last summer, four wooden planters will be built and installed by the Wood Store. The design also includes a community noticeboard and a "Welcome to Round Hill" sign.

ROUND HILL CRIME UPDATE

The committee met the new Police community Support officer, Sophie Powell, she has been the Round Hill PCSO since February 2024, alongside Alex, the PSCO that currently supports the area.

The PSCO role is to support the community, PCSOs are not able to respond to sirens or emergencies, they support with patrolling drug reported areas, safeguarding, and creating relationships in the community getting to know the area, Sophie will patrol her ward a minimum of one day a week.


Community speed watch and neighbourhood watch

THE CATS CREEP WILL NOT BE SPRAYED WITH GLYPHOSATE

Councillor Raphael Hill, told The Reporter: "I took the opportunity to show our Council's new CEO Jess Gibbons around the Cat's Creep, and I was told shortly afterwards that it will be exempt from spraying. Well done to everyone who spoke up about this and for helping to protect our amphibian friends. All other hard surfaces like nearby streets will be sprayed".

Threat to Ditchling Beacon 79 Bus Route By Peter Meakin

In March the council announced it was ending a £58,000 annual subsidy, scrapping the Ditchling Beacon bus and reducing the Devil's Dyke service.



The Breeze up to the Downs routes are just a few of the bus services in the city which receive a subsidy because of their benefit to the community, and in England fares amount to less than half of running costs (2022). Providing residents and visitors car-free access to the South Downs National Park, the Breeze buses tick all the boxes for support, but low passenger numbers have made them a target for the cash-strapped local authority.

Following protests, including a petition signed by over 1000 residents, the decision was reversed, however this is only a temporary reprieve. According to Trevor Muten, Transport and Sustainability Committee Chair: "We have one year more of funding these services and they can only continue beyond that if they're commercially viable. We will be monitoring the passenger numbers".

The Brighton Yoga Foundation, launched in 2016, is a registered charity that brings yoga to those who don't normally have access to it — either due to cost, thinking that yoga is "not for people like me", or being unaware of the benefits. It has raised more than £120,000 in grants. Last year it delivered nearly 300 classes to over 2100 participants, including in Mill View mental health hospital and Lewes prison.

It has also delivered programmes for women recovering from domestic abuse and sexual violence, for people recovering from serious illness and addictions, for young people in schools, chair yoga for those with mobility issues and for homeless people (one of whom has now gone on to train to be a yoga teacher himself!).

The highly successful annual Brighton Yoga Festival was set up in 2014 by Roundhill residents – Davy Jones and Jane Platford. The 11 th festival was on Saturday 15 June at St Georges Church with more than 600 people attending.

Feedback from participants has been incredible – one woman recently wrote to say: "Your classes have literally saved my life." In the last two years it has won two national awards for its work: https://www.brightonyogafoundation.org
